

# Langdale Hall Refurbishment

Langdale Hall has undergone an exciting makeover. In just 13 days over the New Year period, the interior of the hall has been completely transformed. It is cleaner, brighter, has greener credentials and has been remodelled to include additional meeting rooms. In addition there is a refurbished bar area and the sprung dance floor has been stripped and professionally restored.

The overall feel of the hall is cleaner, lighter, warmer, brighter and more modern. There are new facilities such as drink vending machines and ergonomically designed chairs which link with extra-large links to give those seated plenty of space, a new stage and improved electrics for stage lighting.

Where possible lights have been replaced with eco lighting and insulation and heat efficiency has been improved by work to correct draughts and fill holes.

Carpets have also been replaced; toilet cubicles revamped so that they are more spacious and soundproofing has also been improved.

Access for disabled visitors has also been addressed with temporary ramps and push buttons to request assistance.

All this is down to the hard work and dedication of staff, volunteers and local businesses who have pulled out all the stops to meet some very tight deadlines.

The hall will be the main venue for groups and organisations while the Corn Exchange is under review, a public consultation process takes place and various reports are considered.

Langdale Hall reopens for the Blood Transfusion Service on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> January 2012 and will open officially to other user groups on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> January 2012.
