You can now sign up to receive crime alerts through the Thames Valley Community Messaging Service.

Traditionally the system was used for passing information to neighbourhood watch schemes but this is now open to any residents who simply want to keep updated with what's happening in their area.

## Radio scheme arrives in Chipping Norton

Chipping Norton town centre retailers and licensees are being offered the opportunity to join a radio scheme which links them to each other and the local police station.

The radios will raise quicker awareness of incidents as they happen and if CCTV is introduced to the town then the radios will also feed into the control room operator. To date seven premises have signed up.
