BUS STOP GALLERIES FOR TOWN'S COMMUTERS



This summer Witney Town Council is undertaking an exciting project to help bring a whole new look to Witney's bus shelters. The Council has commissioned art work by the students of Abingdon and Witney College which will feature on the panels of shelters across the town. The work forms part of the student's Work Experience. The Town Clerk visited the college to deliver the initial design brief which asked for a focus on the town's heritage and history. In June the Clerk and Councillor Enright, who had proposed the collaboration, with the college's Art students attended a presentation to preview their interpretations.

Residents may have noticed that shelters have already been cleaned and painted in readiness. The artwork will be attached to existing and new Perspex panels and installed.

Work is being carried out the work throughout the coming months and aims to be completed by October to really brighten up the town.

Handmade Poppy Appeal



In 2018 Witney will commemorate the end of WWI with events, including the unveiling of a brand new memorial on the Leys.

We are appealing for help producing knitted, crocheted and other handmade poppies to festoon the town centre. Other towns have successfully 'yarn-bombed' their towns or highlighted particular areas in this way.

We would like to line the route that the soldiers would have taken from mustering in the Market Square, along Church Green, through the churchyard and on to the Leys towards the train station, in this way. Your poppies will be used to adorn bollards, railings and lamp-posts along the route.

We cannot have too many poppies as they can be used individually or made into wreaths, crosses and cascades. The more we have, the greater the impact.

Revealing the Heritage of Tower Hill Cemetery

Witney Town Council's Heritage Open Day



This year we are uncovering the history behind our Victorian cemetery at Tower Hill or "Witney Burial Ground" as it was then known. The chapel will be open and within it some of our older burial records, historic documents and reproductions will be on display. Among these will be maps showing the original burial ground and its extensions, the contracts that were issued to the builders of the time, the mortgage documents and other correspondence.

There will be a self- led heritage trail with explore and discover questions and a guide which will cover:

- o The Commonwealth War Graves
- o The Wishing Tree story
- o The 'local celebrity graves' of Witney's rich and famous
- o The flora and fauna of TH cemetery
- o Who was the first person buried in the cemetery and where is their grave?
- o Bygone occupations

At midday on Saturday 9th **only**, there will be a short service of reflection led by Rev Toby Wright and Father Patrick Broun with music from Witney Town Band.

Limited parking across both days is available at Our Lady and St Hugh Catholic Church and refreshments are also available there.

The free event is open to the public between 11am and 3pm on Friday 8th & Saturday 9th September 2017


