Witney Town Council is looking for people who have given exemplary service, which may be paid or unpaid, who make a real difference to Witney. Residents who go that extra mile to help others will be recognised in the annual awards, presented by the Mayor at the Civic Reception in March next year.

Anyone thinking about nominating a deserving individual as Witney's Citizen of the Year or for any of the other awards has until 30th December to submit their details.

A mix of traditional and modern music will be on offer, with Witney Town Band and WOAPA and the Service will be loosely based on a musical retelling of Dicken's, A Christmas Carol. Police & Community Webpage

Witney Town Council is creating a new webpage within our own site which will allow us to share information and resources from our local police as part of the Community Resilience initiative.

Witney Town Council hope to bring you news about campaigns and projects along with information about staying safe in the community and online and what to do and when to contact the police if something goes wrong. The page is currently under construction but will be uploaded soon.

Public Halls

The Town Council have several venues that are for hire across the town.

The Corn Exchange underwent major refurbishment between 2011 and 2015 and now has two lettable rooms. The Gallery Room occupies the front part of the building on the first floor and can accommodate meetings. conferences and small occasions while the Main Hall is on the ground floor and is perfect for larger gatherings or parties. It is centrally located and there are disabled facilities and a kitchenette for food preparation.

Burwell Hall is a purpose built hall at Thorney Leys in the west of the town. There are fields and a play area immediately adjacent to the building and it has two rooms for hire, the Main Hall which is perfect for classes or parties and The Meeting Room which can hold a small meeting or gathering.

As well as the Halls, the Town Council also has outside venues which are available for hire for events when not in use by regular sports users.

The Witney Town Centre Bus Service, currently being run by Go Ride CIC will now continue until January 2017.

Go Ride have offered to continue the service until the New Year. The Town Council is still working hard to secure a long term viable service beyond that date and will provide updates on this once they are available.

Over the summer Witney Town Council and the Lower Windrush Valley Project conducted a joint survey to find out what people think about Witney Lake and Country Park and how often they use it.

The Town Council will use this information to decide if a Land Management Plan should be implemented and what form this should take. We entered all those respondents who completed the Survey on our App into a draw to win a key to the Bird Hides at Tar Lakes and Standlake nature reserves. Our randomly selected winner was Dan. Dan is in the 19-30 age bracket and lists his activities at the lake as Walking, Running, Bird Watching, Wildlife Interest, Photography and to relax and take time out. Preparing for Winter

Scottish and Southern Electricity Networks is trying to find those people within our town that would need a little extra help or assistance in the event of a power outage in the forthcoming winter months.


If you are eligible and register with them they can come out and ensure you are looked after during a sustained outage. It is a free service, and any information provided is strictly confidential.

They have registered in excess of 700 people in the last 12 months within Oxfordshire but there are many more vulnerable people that are not registered. Those registered will be flagged up to the team should there be a power outage affecting them. The team will go out and visit them and depending on their needs provide practical assistance including offering hot meals, drinks and reassurance. In very high priority cases small generators may be provided for short term use. In addition their Emergency Service Centre will call them during the outage, checking they are ok and giving updates on the estimated time of power restoration.
