TOWN COUNCIL COMMITS £30K FOR YOUTH SERVICES

A £30,000 fund is one of the ways in which Witney Town Council is aiming to support children and young people in the town. The money will go towards supporting sustainable youth work and services. Early in 2019 the Town Council held meetings with key professionals from youth service providers and followed up with direct consultation with the town's youth through a young people's survey. This enabled them to identify problems and issues in the town, available provision and resources, current and future need and any gaps.

While existing provision in the town is of high quality, there are significant gaps and barriers to access that need to be addressed.

Based on the information gathered, the Town Council resolved to set a budget to support Witney-based projects and collaborations working with local children and young

people, to strengthen the town's youth sector provision.

Witney Town Council will also be working alongside agencies at Oxfordshire County and West Oxfordshire District Councils, reviewing and adding to existing directories to create an accessible and definitive 'asset map' of services within the town.

The twin offering from the Town Council consists of the services directory and a fund that could be used to support existing services, create new projects or remove barriers to accessing existing services, for example, by funding discretionary rates.

The consistent message is that the promotion of positive experiences and opportunities for 0-21-year olds demonstrates that the town's young people are valued and that investing in them will have beneficial outcomes.

ALL ABOUT YOUR COUNCIL TAX

The primary source of income for most Parish Councils comes from the Precept, part of the Council Tax. We hope to explain the contribution you make to the Town Council through your Council Tax and how it is spent.

WHAT IS A PRECEPT?

The Town Council receives a small proportion of the local Council Tax. It does not receive any direct funding from central government.

The funding collected pays for the running of the Council and the services it provides.

HOW IS IT CALCULATED?

The Town Council makes an estimate of income and expenditure for the next financial year, including some for future planned projects and/or unexpected events. It is then calculated as an amount per Council Tax Band D Property and added to the Council Tax Bill of all the dwellings within the Parish area.

HOW IS IT RAISED?

West Oxfordshire District Council collects your Council Tax on behalf of the District Council, County Council, Police, Fire and the Precepts for any Parish/Town Councils in their district. It is important to note that Witney Town Council's Precept is just a small percentage of your overall Council Tax Bill.

HOW MUCH IS IT & WHY HAS IT GONE UP?

The Precept charged by Witney Town Council will rise in April by just over a pound a month for the average home (Band D property) increased from £140.36 to £154.40 per annum. This will enable the Council to address concerns raised by residents, and invest in sports facilities, public halls, youth services and the community bus, as well as committing to address the climate emergency declared in June 2019.

This will provide a sound basis for future planning, and in particular:

- A fund for youth services across the town, to plug the gap left by the closure of Base 33 and the lack of youth clubs
- Seed funding for environmental projects to move towards our ambition of net zero carbon Witney by 2028
- Adequate provision of good quality sports pitches including cricket and football for our growing town
- Enough funds to take the next steps in renewing The Corn Exchange, improving Burwell Hall, and refurbishing the Town Hall

HOW IS IT SPENT?

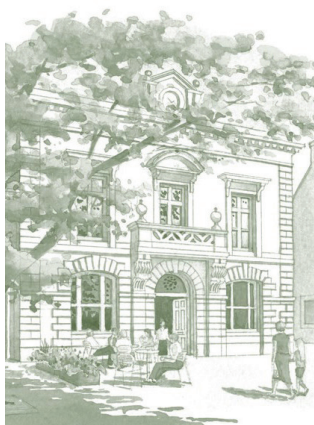
