Witney Town Council has listened to those who have been pushing for improved facilities and embarked on achieving as much as possible of a survey generated wish-list, within the constraints of the space and budget. The designers, Bendcrete are keen to demonstrate how they have fulfilled the vision presented to them and produced a design for an inclusive and accessible community hub for our wheeled sports enthusiasts.




Thank you for all the entries!


And Congratulations to Millie (Aged 9) whose Christmas Card entry was chosen as the perfect cover for the Mayor's Carol Service song sheet.

Are you Weather Ready?

Thinking ahead and preparing for what the weather may bring can make a real difference. Here are a few simple steps you can take to prepare yourself, your vehicle and your home or business.

Take the worry out of winter storms

Consider a separate battery charger, and you could store key information such as the power cut helpline number (105) on your phone.



Weatherproof your home and garden

Think about what might be impacted by strong winds or flooding around your home. Organise maintenance checks and consider moving items.



Check your heating

Cold weather can be a risk to your health especially if you are over 65 or have a long-term health condition. Ideally your home should be heated to more than 18°C.



Freezing and thawing can cause pipe bursts. Check your pipes are insulated especially outside and make sure you know where your stop tap is.



Make alternative plans

You may need alternative commuting plans for severe weather, and alternative childcare plans in case of school or nursery closures.



Have basic supplies to hand

Put useful things such as water, torch, and batteries plus emergency numbers in a bag in case a storm takes out power, water or phone lines.

Help give them the recognition they deserve by nominating them for Citizen of the Year


Carers, volunteers, charity fundraisers, anyone you think deserves appreciation.





Every day you'll be able to uncover a new activity that you can do with your children. It's packed with ideas from baking gingerbread reindeer and creating snowflake decorations to going for a winter walk to spot the Christmas lights.

All the ideas are either free or low cost and importantly - lots of fun to do too!

Home-Start Oxford provides non-judgemental, free support to families, through both oneto-one volunteer support as well as running a number of free parent and toddler groups. Whether it be mental health issues, illness, disability, relationship stress, isolation, abuse, addiction or poverty - Home-Start is there to help families in need.

Kerry Center, Home-Start Oxford's Head of Family Support said: "Christmas is a magical time but it can also be one of the hardest times for families, especially with the added cost of living pressures. We always have this in mind. It's why our stay and play groups are free and why we run special free events over the summer holidays too. We decided to create the advent calendar for families so everyone can keep the Christmas spirit going but not have to worry about the expense that normally goes with it."
