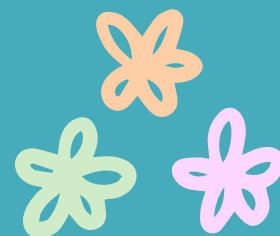

DOG FOULING

The majority of dog walkers behave responsibly and bag and bin their dog's poo – thank you. But to those who do not, here is an important message:

Dog mess is a major public concern. It is considered one of the most unacceptable and offensive types of litter in our public spaces. It's a significant issue for many, including dog owners, not only because of the mess it creates but also due to health risks.

For these reasons, it is crucial for dog walkers to clean up after their pets, regardless of the location. Don't assume it's acceptable to leave it in an isolated field or hidden in long grass.

Please avoid walking or exercising your dog in designated children's play areas and prevent your dog from pooing on marked sports pitches. Our sports teams have to clean up dog mess from the pitches each week before they can play.

Witney Town Council is receiving more complaints than ever about this issue.

Finding increasing amounts of dog mess in cemeteries is particularly sensitive and upsetting. There are reminders about cleaning up after your dog on all the new noticeboards at the entrances to our cemeteries, play areas and the Lake and Country Park. There are plenty of bins in the cemetery, and all dogs must be on leads while in Tower Hill or Windrush Cemetery.

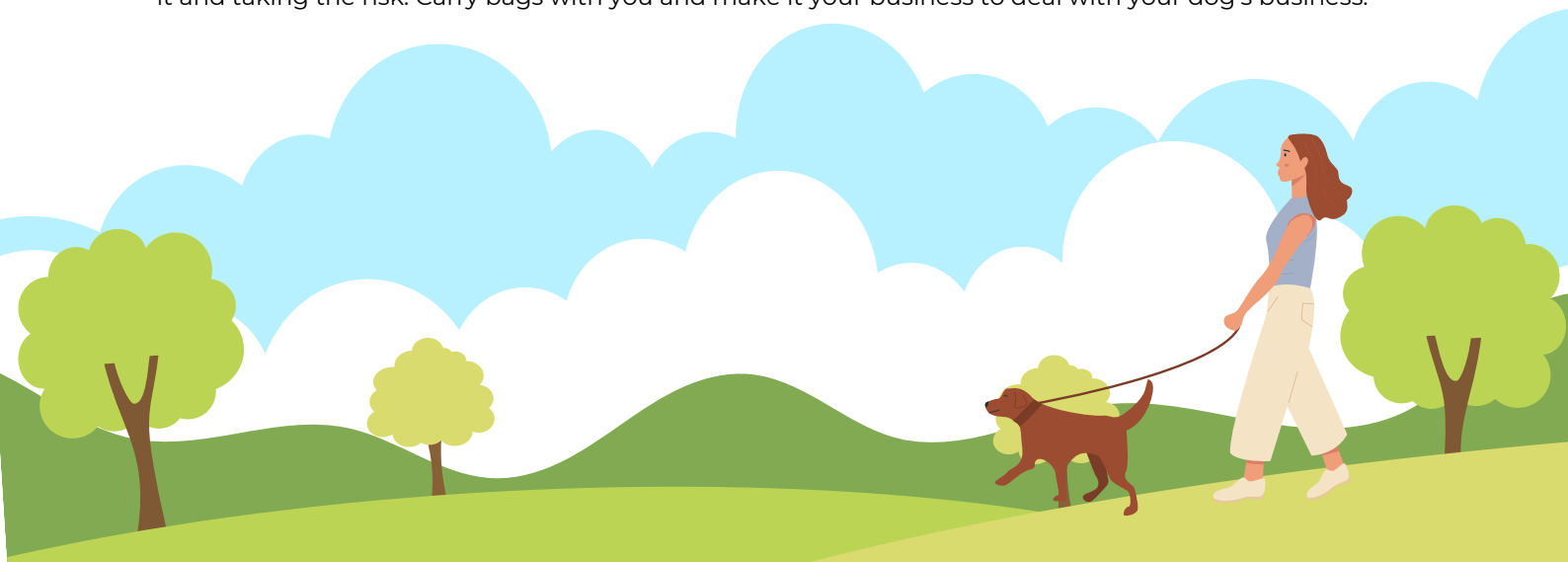
We ask you to be particularly vigilant if your dog is with you. Keep it close and be aware of what it is doing at all times.

Let's respect the cemetery and its purpose. Remember that it is meant to be a place of reflection and remembrance, and ensure that no visitors are distressed by careless dog owners who do not clean up after their pets.

Here's what the law says about dog fouling:

Dog fouling occurs when a person allows a dog in their care to foul in a public place and fails to clean it up immediately. Failure to clear up dog fouling on public land is a criminal offence, and anyone found neglecting this duty can be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice. Public places include roads, gutters, footpaths, verges, pedestrian areas, parks, school playing fields, sports grounds, and cemeteries.

You can be fined for not clearing up, but it's such a quick task that there is no valid reason for not doing it and taking the risk. Carry bags with you and make it your business to deal with your dog's business.

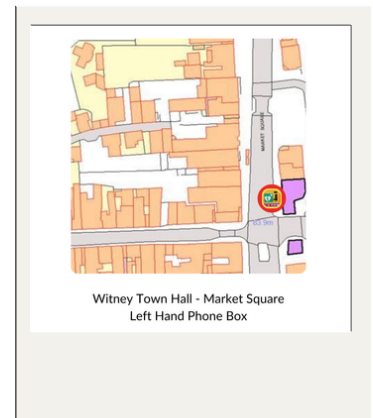
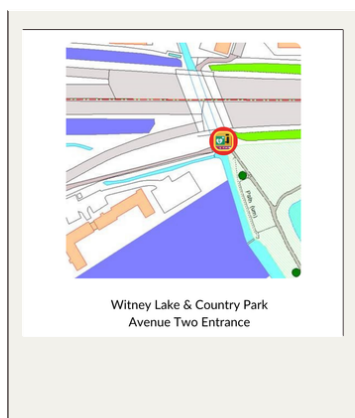
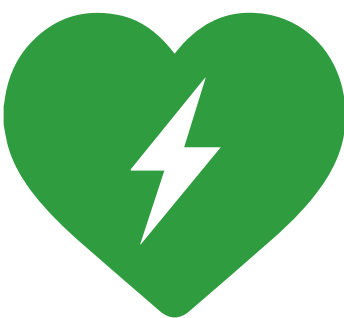
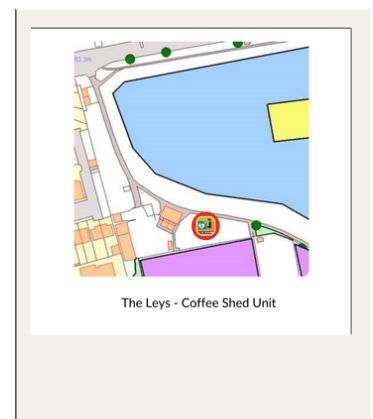
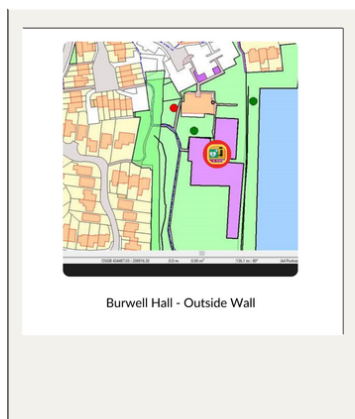
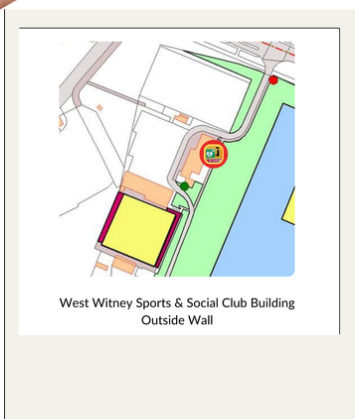


Defibrillators

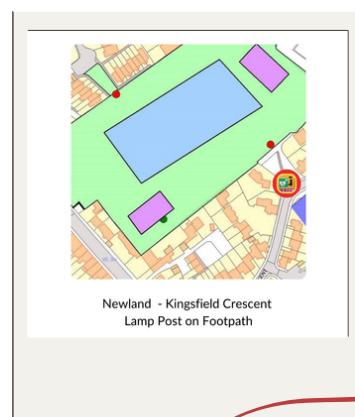
Here is a list and maps showing the locations of defibrillators that Witney Town Council maintains. There are many more to be found across the town but these are the ones that the Council has installed, or been gifted or taken on responsibility for and check regularly.

It is worth noting that all WTC maintained defibs are installed on external walls of buildings or other outside places. They are accessible 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Our defibrillators are all registered on 'The Circuit' which first responders use when looking for a unit.

As a thank you to our dedicated and hard-working volunteers, and also part of our 50th anniversary celebrations, we hosted an afternoon picnic at the Witney Lake with cakes, sandwiches, and a lovely view of the paddling ducks.

THE WITNEY SHED

The Witney Shed collaborates by creating wooden animal habitats, signage posts, and the tern raft in Witney Lake using provided designs. They receive wood in return and repurpose discarded plastic for signage backing and bird box roofing.

COMMUNITY GARDENERS

Community gardeners from various organizations like Burwell Community Garden, Edible Gardens, and Witney Horticultural Society maintain public spaces, creating pollinator-friendly oases with reused seeds and cuttings, open composting, and water-saving practices. Their efforts require year-round work to keep the areas vibrant and sustainable.

COUNTRY PARK VOLUNTEERS

Country Park volunteers have transformed the area into a habitat for over 110 bird species and numerous insects. They assist the Green Spaces team with tasks like maintaining the park and lake, including litter picking and removing invasive plants.

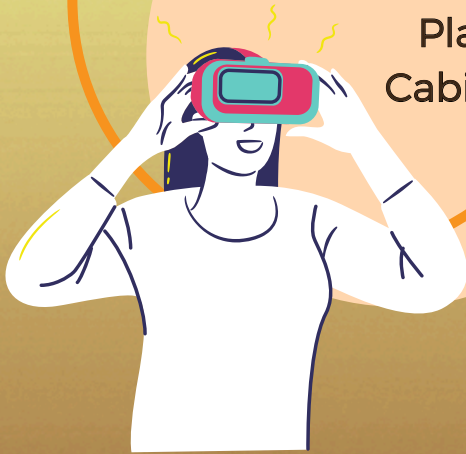

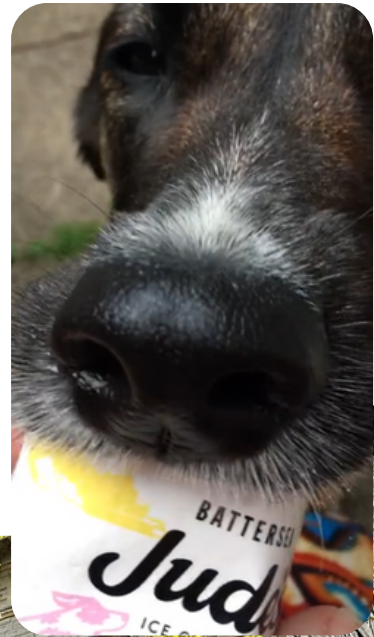

Community Speedwatch



Witney had another successful and positive Community Speedwatch session last week. Volunteers monitored the speed of almost three hundred vehicles. As before, the majority of drivers were travelling at safe and responsible speeds.

Local residents were pleased to see the Speedwatch team and keen to thank them for helping to make the community safer, by encouraging motorists to be aware of their speed.

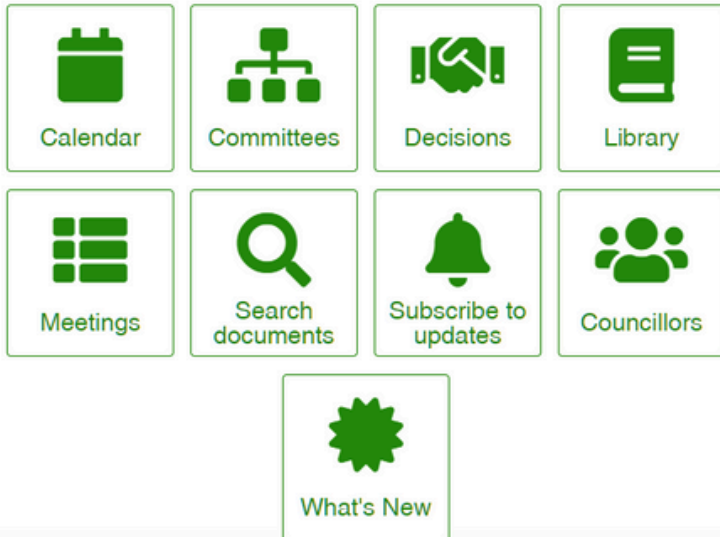
