

Bulb Planting and Tidying at Unterhaching Park

The Witney Woodland Volunteers joined forces with Witney Town Council's Green Spaces Team to start work on the programme of work designed to improve and revitalise Unterhaching park.

They planted native bluebells, snowdrops and wood anemones, trimmed back overgrown vegetation, and swept the pathways. The flowers will bloom in spring, enhancing biodiversity and adding a vibrant splash of colour to the park. Cutting back the overgrowth also helps protect young plants and ensures healthier regrowth when the warmer weather returns.

Next steps will continue to make the area more welcoming and safer, with further work to lift the tree canopy to improve lines of sight through the park and create more light along the paths.

Flying the Witney Town Flag







Our Town Crest-themed Community Window

Witney Town Council is proud to announce that the town flag will be flown every day above the Town Hall, except when replaced by a national or local flag for special occasions. Our town flag features Witney's heraldic crest, symbolising its community identity, and the town's historical roots.

Officially granted on 9 September 1955, the crest is rich with meaning. The white and blue wavy band reflects the River Windrush and its landscape, while the two leopards' faces with shuttles come from the Blanket Makers' arms. The glove represents Witney's former glove-making industry, and the Buttercross at the base symbolises the historic heart of the town.




The Paschal lamb, a long-standing symbol of the town, also represents the Mount, where the Bishops of Winchester built a palace in the 11th century. Together, these symbols highlight Witney's industrious spirit and enduring heritage.

Primary school place - you must apply now

If your child was born on or between 1 September 2021 and 31 August 2022, you need to apply for a primary school place now.

You must still apply even if your child already attends a nursery attached to the school.
